





Dear Member of the Manufacturing Community,

We are pleased to invite you to join us for the first meeting of the **Advisory Group** on **Digital Manufacturing** (ISO TC184/SC4/AG1) to be held **Tuesday**, **14** – **Wednesday**, **15**, **June** in **Troy**, **New York**.

Digital Manufacturing is the definition and control of manufacturing processes using models that include Geometric Dimensions and Tolerances (GD&T). The inclusion of GD&T allows intelligent applications to optimize, monitor and inspect machining programs in real time, before, after and during the machining.

Advisory Group 1 is developing a roadmap for the deployment of digital manufacturing. At this meeting we will analyze early results of two projects: "Mind the Gap" (DMDII 14-02-02) is developing a suite of tools for optimizing machining processes which promise to make machining programs of the future 15% more efficient; "O3" (DMDII 14-06-05) is developing a system for measuring machining results in real time using a virtual CMM, eliminating many errors, and allowing customers to understand the true geometries of their parts in advance of their shipment.

The meeting will be held at the offices of STEP Tools, Inc. in Troy NY. Troy is about 100 miles north of New York City on the Hudson River. The airport is shared with Albany and is about 10 miles away on fast roads. There are lots of direct connections to many USA cities including many that are International gateways.

Transport – Air

There are direct connections to Philadelphia, Newark, Baltimore, Washington (Dulles and National), Chicago (Midway and O'Hare), Atlanta, Detroit and Orlando. Those who travel overseas frequently usually go via Philadelphia. There are some flights to NYC (JFK) and Boston but they use small commuter planes.

Transport – New York City

The normal way for visitors to get from New York City is by train. This follows the river and is quite pretty. The best trains take 2.5 hours but most take a bit over 3 hours. Go to the AMTRAK web site to make bookings. The train station is a taxi ride away from downtown Troy and is called Albany/Rensselaer. If you are on a budget then there are many buses to downtown Albany from where you can also get to a Taxi to Troy. There is no Uber in New York State.

Transport – Other international gateway airports

Visitors to Troy sometimes fly to Boston which is a 3.5 hour drive and Montreal which is a 4.5 hour drive. The time from Boston can be much slower if you hit commuter traffic. The drive from Montreal is through the Adirondacks and is very pretty but requires crossing the international border which used to be horrendous but has now settled down.
